

## CARLTON IN LINDRICK PARISH COUNCIL

A meeting of the Parish Council was held at the Carlton Civic Centre, Carlton in Lindrick on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> December 2025.

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors J. Bowker, V. Bowles, G. Bradley and District Councillors R. Carrington-Wilde and D. Pidwell.

Prior to commencement of Council's official business, the Chairman announced that in accordance with the Openness of Local Government Bodies Regulations, audio/visual recording and photography at Council meetings is permitted in accordance with the Council's protocol "Filming of Public Meetings".

### 56. POLICE REPORT

Members received a statistical report for November 2025 and information on action taken against quad bike riders.

### 57. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Residents in attendance raised an issue relating to a property wall being damaged by highway traffic manoeuvring in Grange Close. In addition, comment was made on the unsatisfactory condition and appearance of flags on display in the Parish. In response, County Councillor Dale agreed to investigate appropriate action.

### 60. NOTTS COUNTY COUNCIL ISSUES

Councillor Dale updated members on street parking restrictions to be imposed on Churchfield Close, and on ongoing problems relating to the hedge obstructing the view of motorists emerging from Poppy Field Way onto the A60 highway.

In addition, Councillor Dale reiterated the responsibilities being addressed by the developer of the Poppy Field Way estate in relation to adoption and maintenance of highway and other services. Problems relating to highway pot holes on the A60 highway were also highlighted.

61. BASSETLAW DISTRICT COUNCIL ISSUES

Councillor Scotthorne reported on a number of issues being addressed by the District Council including taxi licensing conditions and requirements, construction skills training for students employed on historical building in the District including Retford Road Cemetery Chapel and Bassetlaw Museum. A variety of skills are being applied including stone masonry, joinery, and lime plastering! The scheme is funded through external grants made by the UK Shared Prosperity Fund.

In addition, details were reported of a funding application made to the government for £20 million pounds to regenerate Worksop Town Centre during the next decade. The outcome of the application should be known by April 2006.
