A fairly drawn out process involving wide consultation with the local community has culminated in your Neighbourhood Plan being submitted for the attention of the Bassetlaw District Council prior to its validity being considered by an independent Planning Inspector having the power to determine its suitability for a referendum to be held when all of the Parish Electorate will be invited to vote for or against its adoption for the development of this Village over the next 15 years. **Adoption of the plan will mean that will have a say on future proposals for the Village rather than development decisions being left solely to other authorities.**

In the meantime, the Parish Council is busy making arrangements for the new burial ground in Hundred Acre Lane to be developed – it is anticipated that work will start on the 3rd September 2018.

Some of you will be aware of the excellent outdoor feature developed by students of the North Notts College at our Youth Club at Costhorpe. The outdoor landscape feature is a credit to the College, its staff and students and has added so much quality to the Centre which continues to improve on services for young people in the area which are second to none! The work at the Centre is a first class example of what can be achieved through joint partnership arrangements in this case your Parish Council, the Notts County Council and the North Notts College. It is just one example of the ongoing policy of your Parish Council in ensuring good community services and development by working directly with members of the Notts County Council, the Bassetlaw District Council and the Police who partake in joint discussions at Parish Council meetings each month.

Finally, the Annual Family Fun day has just been held at the Civic Centre. Good weather, good attendance and certainly “good fun” was enjoyed by all those who came along in increased numbers and the organisation of the activities was a credit to the Civic Centre Staff. The event is increasing annually in terms of popularity and is a great opportunity for parents to join their kids for an ‘inexpensive’ and happy fun day. Long may it continue.
