### IN MEMORY

The month of November 2018 quite rightly highlighted the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the end of the 1914-18 World War 1.

The Parish Council arranged for the early siting of the renowned poppy tribute to be recognised through the placement of 'poppy's' on lamp standards and other street furniture throughout the Village and new seating with appropriate plaque testaments was arranged at the War Memorial prior to the 11<sup>th</sup> November.

On the 9<sup>th</sup> November 2018 representatives of the Parish Council were privileged to attend a memorial testament organised by the pupils of Ramsden Primary School. A number of the pupils very capably read out researched information on those hero's from Carlton in Lindrick families who had been lost in conflict and everyone in attendance joined the pupils for a memorial service conducted by the Reverend Mark Orr at the War Memorial.

All those involved in the organisation of the moving tribute and occasion are to be congratulated on their presentation which brought home to everyone the ongoing importance of generations remembering with gratitude the ultimate price paid by those who gave their own lives in order that we might enjoy our freedom and liberty. Those valiant hero's and their families should never ever be forgotten.

On the 11<sup>th</sup> November 2018 the Annual Community Service of Remembrance was held at St John's Church and floral tributes were laid at the War Memorial. The Memorial Service was extremely well attended and the ongoing increase in those wishing to be present serves once again to emphasise the gratitude we should all continue to recognise for the courage and bravery of those who secured our freedom.

### BURIAL GROUND – HUNDRED ACRE LANE

Many of you will have seen that work has commenced on the new burial ground in Hundred Acre Lane. It is anticipated that given fair weather conditions the contract will be



completed around April 2019 – Qualified Quantity Surveyors and Clerks of Works employed by A1 Housing are supervising the work on a weekly basis on behalf of the Parish Council.

### NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

At the time of writing the Neighbourhood Plan which has been approved by the Parish Council is being finalised by an independent Inspector at the Department of the Environment. The Inspector has currently suggested minor amendments in some of the phraseology in the document and his final observations are awaited. It is currently anticipated that a referendum on the adoption or otherwise of the plan will take place on a date to be determined by the Bassetlaw District Council early in 2019.
