

Carlton in Lindrick Parish Council

A meeting of the Parish Council was held at the Civic Centre, Long Lane, Carlton in Lindrick, Worksop, on 10th January 2023.

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors E. Banks, L. Billau, C. Connolly, N. Gray, S. Scotthorne, District Councillors R. Carrington-Wilde and D. Pidwell.

County Councillor C. Bailey and Peter Goulding (Parish Clerk) were in attendance.

Prior to commencement of Council's official business, the Chairman announced that in accordance with the Openness of Local Government Bodies Regulations, audio/visual recording and photography at Council meetings is permitted in accordance with the Council's protocol "Filming of Public Meetings". The Chairman asked if anyone present intended to record proceedings.

115. POLICE AND PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Police representatives were welcomed to the meeting and reported on ongoing anti-social behaviour incidents in the village. Dispersal Orders have been made in support of procedures to minimize the gatherings of offenders and various agencies continue to cooperate in trying to resolve the incidents.

The incidents have widened, to include damage and nuisances on public transport and increased police patrols have been established. The ages of offenders continue to frustrate action which can lawfully be implemented.

Councillor Bailey reported to members on street lighting defects experienced in Long Lane, repairs to Highway pot holes and consultation on new primary school provision at Gateford, Worksop.

Members were also updated on school bus control activities in addition to a backlog on statutory action relating to footpaths and bridleways. Councillor Bailey also reported on a

backlog of action relevant to a 3 year programme for required highway surface defects and a particular problem in Rotherham Baulk was highlighted

a) Queen Elizabeth II Commemoration (Minute 109(1) refers)
